Through his Grief Groups, Dr. Boyle has been instrumental in helping individuals cope with the grieving process by "moving from preoccupation to periphery," making room for something new.

In addition to seeing couples and individual clients, they have assisted Dr. Boyle in leading the Counseling Center's Grief Groups.
